The 65th National TCA Convention was held in Albuquerque, New Mexico June 22–June 30. The Convention was well attended, with 15 members and their guests from our Division and 757 attendees in total. As always, there were great tours, great food and numerous train layouts with most scales represented. Most important to me was the time I had to catch up with friends from around the country and make some new ones. The Train Marketplace had some unique treasures for many of us collectors and operators too. Special thanks to my good friends Scott & Elaine Eckstein, Chris Allen and the entire Rio Grande Chapter's convention committee for a spectacular event, including the weather.

The 66th National TCA Convention will be held in Jacksonville, FL. This will be hosted by the Southern Division. The convention hotel is the Hyatt Regency Jacksonville-Riverfront. Jacksonville is about a 16 -18 hour Amtrak ride from Washington D.C

TCA National announced a revised WIN BIG program for this year. The program's goal is to attract new members to our great hobby and will award five (5) \$500 gift certificates to TCA members that sign up the highest number of new members. In addition, any member that

You may also purchase your tickets at the Division Table that day.


Attendance seemed less than typical, this time, possibly due to 'end of summer vacation plans'

Feature Article

HALLMARK CHRISTMAS LIONEL ORNAMENTS—2019 UPDATE By: Terry L. Trickel, TCA # 79-13707

In 2018, I authored an article on Hallmark Lionel Keepsake Christmas Ornaments in *Atlantic Division Express*' 2018-4 Winter issue (adtca.com/newsletter-archive/). In the article, I described that Hallmark produced three series of ornaments, (1) Original, (2) Complements, and (3) Miniatures. For accuracy, two corrections to the original article are: (1) the 2010 UP long Streamline Coach and Streamline Observation are reassigned as Complements and (2) the 2005 Miniatures series has a limited edition Polar Express seven-piece set.

Hallmark now has 24 original locomotives issued from 1996 through 2019. The 2019 edition is a Lionel Scout #1001 locomotive. The Complement for the locomotive is a Scout tender and a #1007 caboose. An additional Complement is the limited edition gold painted Lionel Scout #1001 locomotive. The 2019 Miniature series is a Southern A-B-A, F3 unit.



I created a "HALLMARK LIONEL KEEPSAKE YARDS" display for my collection. The Lionel display sign top portion was sold by Hallmark. I made a base for it from LEGO blocks for height and the Hallmark Keepsake Yards signs. The track is N-scale with an Atlas turntable. The outside circle of track is powered to run the Hallmark Thomas locomotive for my grandson Matthew and is powered by a Life Like 0-6-0 chassis.

My last purchased item was the Chessie Steam Special locomotive (2009) in gold paint and very rare. Sorry, the engine was not on the layout when photos were made. The collection is now complete. However, I plan to add additional sidings and/or enlarge the platform to provide additional track for future items. My next challenge is to create a display for the Miniatures series.

A few notes on collecting the Hallmark Ornaments: The Hallmark Lionel collection is a joy to collect at a fraction of cost of the full size Lionel trains and also takes a fraction of the space. In the early years, the ornaments were packed with a 'collector's card' of the locomotive or car and housed in a plastic shell that fit the box. In subsequent years, the card disappeared and the plastic shell was replaced by tissue paper.

The first NYC Hudson locomotive, issued in 1996, did not have a tender as a Complement and so I added a matching tender to this locomotive. In addition, the limited edition gold Complement locomotives do not come with tenders, but for my collection, I have purchased additional Complement tenders and plan to repaint these to match the locomotives.

Most of the Hallmark trains are near N-scale Continued on page 8



size trains. There are a few smaller in size and some larger than the others. Not all wheels will fit on the N scale track. I found that locomotives will sit on the track, but the tenders do not fit very well; and the trains are top heavy and often tip over. When I find a permanent location to display the layout, I will add tacky putty to the underside of the trains to keep them in place.

Hallmark offers a wide variety of *Keepsake Ornaments*, such as cars,
